EVERY CASE IS A CLASSROOM

A family drove to the Veterinary Teaching Hospital late one night after Copper, their year-old mixed breed, escaped from the backyard and came back hurt. He seemed stable, but X-rays revealed a diaphragmatic hernia – his organs had shifted into his chest cavity.

The case became a classroom. Fourth-year students worked through triage and stabilization. Anesthesia students learned what happens when a patient with a compromised diaphragm goes under sedation. ICU students tracked his recovery, reading subtle changes in his breathing. A resident scrubbed into her first diaphragmatic hernia repair.

Copper went home fully recovered. The students who worked on his case will carry what they learned into every emergency room, every operating suite, and every clinic they walk into for the rest of their careers.

This team does this every day. The new hospital doesn't change who they are. It changes how many families get the answer they drove here for.

NAMING OPPORTUNITIES

Every space listed here is where an animal gets treatment, a student learns to become a veterinarian, or a family waits through the hardest hour of their year. A gift at this level puts your values into a place where lives change for decades.

FULL SURGICAL FLOOR

A single naming gift for the second floor. A defining naming opportunity, and a lasting presence in the education of generations of veterinarians.

INDIVIDUAL SURGERY SUITE

Each of the eight suites is available for individual naming. This is the specific room where the surgery happens – where a student rotates for weeks and a faculty surgeon practices for a career.

SPECIALTY AREA

The anesthesia prep area, student rounds room, and connecting spaces – the infrastructure that makes the suites function.

THE DEADLINE - EARLY JUNE, 2026

The Virginia Tech Board of Visitors approves the final project scope based on confirmed donor commitments. Agreements must be in hand by June 7 for the surgical suites to be included in the submission for approval.

After that date, the second floor is shelled out. When the college returns to finish it, the cost is at least \$12 million – \$4 million more – on an uncertain timeline.
